Mille Miglia to the Schweinefiletring

Eight stalwart club Miateers recently made a 1000 mile roundtrip to southern Indiana to compete in Tire Squeal 2020. The event involves driving a 175 mile loop of roads, taking in the scenery and stopping to sample the local cuisine (if that's the appropriate term). The route is named after Germany's 17.5 mile Nürburgring. Since it's Indiana, it's called The Schweinefiletring™ (translation: Pork Tenderloin Ring)!

Steve & Pat Dettmer, Jarvis & Marsha Gamble, Bill Potvin & Linda Myers and Greg & Terri Wilkins took a seven hour scenic route (devised by Greg) from Findlay to Bloomington, the site of Indiana University and situated on the western edge of "the ring." Home for the next three nights was Century Suites, featuring one and two bedroom suites in a cluster of unique houses. The group dined that



night at Salt Creek Brewery, one of the sponsoring eateries of the event. It was a fun place, but we were disappointed that they were out of pork tenderloins, the featured meal for Tire Squeal, which would have provided 25 points in the contest.

Actually, we were only half-hearted participants in the contest. It involved garnering points for 10 stops on the route, as well as for eating at four restaurants, with extra points for ordering pork tenderloins. There were also points to be had for solving riddles and for contributing to Gleaners food bank, which was the charity benefiting from the event. We played along a bit, but chose to focus our attention on the great roads of Brown County and the surrounding area, as well as enjoying each others' company.

During our stay, we ate at Sgt Rick's American Grill and Nick's English Hut, both of which DID serve pork tenderloin

sandwiches, so when in Rome ... We also had a nice meal at the restaurant at our hotel, the Indian Palace. Being mostly unfamiliar with Indian food, our servers made some great recommendations and we were all very happy with the results.

We drove the entire Schweinefiletring[™] route in one day. The organizers provided detailed instructions, so there was no issue of getting lost. Some of the points of interest eluded us, though, and required a bit of backtracking before we found them. The weather was perfect for top-down motoring and, as promised, the roads were interesting and the scenery was beautiful. Brown County lived up to its reputation.

The next day was spent touring the area on our own. We had all heard of French Lick, but besides getting a chuckle out of the name, none of us really appreciated its features and history. It was only a little more than an hour from Bloomington, so we headed south to see what the attraction was. Turns out the town has a lot to offer. In the early part of the 20th century it was a destination for those seeking the mineral springs there. That explains the two huge hotels in town, the nearly 700 room French Lick Resort Hotel and Casino and the West Baden Springs Hotel. We toured the grand French Lick Hotel and enjoyed a nice lunch nearby.

We also learned that the town is semi-famous for a) Pluto Water, the best selling laxative in the early 1900's, b) the place where Franklin D. Roosevelt announced his candidacy for president, c) the hotel where tomato juice was invented, and d) the birthplace of Larry Byrd, basketball great. Who knew?

After lunch, we headed south again, traveling on scenic and twisty IN 145 on our way to and from Tell City on the Ohio River. There we enjoyed the view, followed by ice cream treats at a local soft serve place. It was the end of our Indiana experience, and the next day we each followed our own routes home in continued good weather. We all agreed that It had been a terrific four day adventure.
