The event was held again this year, and this time, Terry and Sherri Koral, Tom and Dean Thayer, and Steve Beam joined in the fun.

Willow Run is the site of the Ford Motor plant where nearly 9,000 B-24 bombers were produced during WWII. It's now home to the Yankee Air Museum. The day was warm and sunny and the tarmac was filled with dozens of planes of all ages and types.

> There were cars representing the Indy 500 from its earliest days, along with classics from the 1920's through today. For our group, those built in the 50's and 60's brought back lots of memories from our youth.

Tom Thayer and Bill Potvin spent a lot of time looking at two 1964 Corvair Spyder convertibles, a model both had owned way back when. They still represent a unique design for the time with

their turbocharged rear engines, 4-speed transmissions and fully independent suspensions. Terry Koral was impressed by a lot of the

was a beautifully restored 40's drop-canvas vegetable truck.
