The Tire Squeal is Set for June 20-28

The folks in Indiana are still planning to hold their event, since it is centered around driving and eating, and involves no mass gatherings. By June, Indiana plans to have no complicating restrictions. Up-to-date info will be posted on the Tire Squeal website regarding any changes.

The event involves driving a loop of southern Indiana roads at your own pace, while stopping to sample the local food, featuring that "delicacy", Indiana Pork Tenderloin, described as a bigger-than-bun, hubcap-sized-breaded pork sandwich. The route is named after Germany's Nürburgring. Since it's Indiana, it's called The Schweinefiletring $^{\text{TM}}$ (translation: Pork Tenderloin Ring)!



It's set up as a charity event for Gleaners Food Bank of Indiana, so donations are appreciated, but not required. There is also a competition aspect, where you can score points to win prizes by visiting points of interest and restaurants. 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10th Anniversary Bash Draws Largest Group Ever

The attendance record for a NWOhio Miata Club event was handily broken when 56 people in 30 cars participated in the combination meander/funcana/picnic on Saturday, June 25.

A goodly number of participants arrived early at the starting point, so even with the big crowd and several housekeeping chores to take care of, the group was away on time. The meander consisted of a fairly direct route along the Maumee River, ending at Don & Barbara Barkley's farm, between Grand Rapid and Napoleon. The only deviation was a loop to include the twisty Tontogany Creek Road. This road was part of the first Miata Meander in 1995 and this event marked its ninth use by the club. That factoid was just one of the 20 answers to questions in the Hysterical Historical Game. Along the route, drivers and passengers were challenged to identify signs and search their memories regarding the history of the club.

A break at the Barkley's provided a convenience stop, a chance for some refreshment and time to distribute the nifty commemorative t-shirts that were included in the entry fee. Mike Kraus did a super job with the artwork and arrangements for the printing, and he received many well-deserved compliments for the design.

After the pause, it was a short trip to Oakwood Plaza in Napoleon, site of the funcana. The parking lot was huge, with plenty of space for the event and for staging the competitors. Thankfully, there was also lots of shade, since the temperature hit 98 degrees. The organizers had planned ahead, though, providing copious amounts of ice water, as well as a porta-potty.

As predicted, the funcana was a lot of laughs. Points were first garnered in three games: tossing and catching a ball in a plastic cone, attempting to fly model airplanes through a large arch, and shooting kid's (actually a granddaughter's) basket. Cars were driven to each of these stations and then on to the timed portion of the run. In the initial part, a five cone slalom was negotiated, as the passenger tried to knock cans off the pylons with bean bags. Still on the clock, the driver was then blindfolded and had to drive a course between cones and stop on a line, all under the direction of the passenger.

Sheila and Dick Krieger did a great job planning this event. Everything was well-organized and with the help of the Barkleys, Bishes and Krauses as timers and scorers, all the cars completed the course in good time and we were off to the farm again for the cook-out, socializing and prize giving.
