

Coronavirus Restrictions Still Allow for Topdown Fun



A Short History of the NWOhio Chapter

The NWOhio Miata Club had its beginnings in the Spring of 1995. Founder Bill Potvin had purchased his Miata the previous November and had spent the snowy months dreaming of top-down adventures and gathering information on chapter formation. Armed with a charter for a string of zip codes in the northwest quadrant of the state and a list of MCA members in the area, he planned an organizational meeting for April. One other car appeared - but that was enough. The NWOhio Chapter was officially established.

That first year saw the membership grow to nine cars and activities included two railies and several tours, including one where members rode in a mule powered canal boat. The tours were called "Miata Meanders", a term that was later to be incorporated into the official club logo. The high point of the season for the small but hearty group was attending the Rock 'n' Roll National Miata Rally, held that year in Cleveland, where four out of

eight NWOhio cars were in attendance - a full 50% of the membership!

The club continued to grow in 1996 both in membership and activities with 19 cars participating. It was that year that the pattern was established for our mainstay events: Saturday or Sunday tours over the nicest roads we can find, culminating at what can only be described as offbeat restaurants. Again we had a good contingent of five cars at the international convention, Mista '96 in Toronto.

It was also in 1996 that our newsletter took shape. The first year we had published two issues under a generic title. For '97 we held a contest to name the publication that would keep us in touch and herald our activities. As the editor warned, "Unless you want to live with a lame title like Retro Rag, I suggest you get those cards and letters in asap." Even with that admonition the response was a bit underwhelming. Nonetheless, we chose a name that appears to be unique, and is



unmistakable as a Miata club newsletter. The M Edition.

Our third year really represented prowth and maturity for the club. We had now reached the critical mass that allowed us to elect a siste of officers and plan a full calendar of events. Still wanting to keep the organizational work from getting in the way of our type of low-key fun, we went with a President, Technical Chairman, Autocross Coordinator, and a combination Treasurer/Editor/ Membership Chairman. Our dub identity was enhanced with a member designed logo which now adorns the shirts and caps worn by our members.



As small as our group is, we are not able to sponsor our own autocross series. We're very fortunate, however, to be located in the NWOR-SCCA Region, one of the premier Solo II clubs in the country. Several of our members



perscipate regularly in their excellent events and our autocross chairman acts as coach and provides driving tips in our newsletter.

Among our most successful recent events have been a trip to the Auburn - Cord - Duesenberg Museum in Auburn, Indiana, a plonic at Hidden Lake Gardens, a lovely arboretum in Michigan and a Meander to the G & R Tavern in Waldo, Ohio. A culinary legend, this eatery features their 'world famous' grilled bologna

sandwich, complete with cheese, onion and sweet pickles. Now how many other groups would take a 300 mile trip for a bologna sandwich?

As the NWOhio Chapter enters its fifth year and celebrates the tenth anniversary of the Milata, we number about 40 cars. Our interest in and excitement about the world's most popular roadster has never been greater. We welcome all those who visit our area to join us in our special brand of top down fun!
