## 2021 Riverrun by Steve & Pat Beam




The 2021 Eric's Riverrun was a fun event for us. As in the past, Pat and I drove to Columbus on Friday evening and spent the night resting up for the Saturday drive. And as in past events, we split this Riverrun into a two day drive. The first day started at the Bob Evans in Pickerington with registration and meeting with the participants. The unofficial count was around 50, with a big flock of Miatas from the Buckeye Miata Club, several from North Coast and us. We admired the older British cars, sport sedans, Corvettes, Honda S2000s and the Subarus. An exception was that our Miata was in the shop getting a suspension, wheel and tire upgrade, so we drove our Mazda 3 hatchback.

We took off by ourselves around 9 am following the two page list of directions that would take us to Marietta for the return trip. The sun was bright, the air was cool and I was anxious to

see if the "3" could keep pace with the others. HA, not to worry! With the "3" shifter in 'sport' mode

and manual, we caught up with and I was able to keep pace with the two Corvettes who were just ahead. Up and down, take this curve and that, follow the printed directions, down shifts were fast, faster than I can do manually, up-shifts were also quick, turn left here, go 1.6 miles and turn right, follow for 12 miles, at the T, go right.... We followed the Corvettes all the way, passing a half dozen British cars attending to a breakdown. We were closely followed by a Ford Fiesta Si and by an Escort RT. The 'Vettes were only a little over the speed limit, so we were able to keep up.





The next morning we faced another two pages of directions plus rain and fog, and no-one to follow. This will be fun ... maybe. For me it was a test of my driving skills, the not-a-sport-car, wet roads, stock all season tires, and did I say rain, fog? As we progressed, we almost ran into a young steer that had wandered from his herd, a small herd of whitetails who raced along with us, and then a fallen tree that stopped us in the middle of a sentence that said "stay on Blackdoom road for 6.8 miles". Pat was an excellent navigator, and she found a detour that was as much fun as any of the roads so far. As I gained confidence in the manual-sport shifter, and the tires on the wet roads I gradually quickened the pace to a point that I scared myself a little bit, so backed off some, but still kept up the pace. I like that automatic in manual shift mode with 'Sport' selected. With Pat reading off the directions, the car preforming well, we made up the time lost to the fallen tree detour, and made the usual ice cream stop in Zanesville at the prescribed lunch break. We had completed the 2021 Riverrun safely, covered the second leg of 130.6 miles, the rain had stopped, lunch was great and we were still talking to each other.

After lunch, home was only a couple of hours away. Next year please come with us. This is really a fun driving event.
